

Like many young couples with children who can't afford to live in a big city, Ronit and her family move to Kibbutz Kfar-Aza on the Israeli/Gaza border.

The film documents three years after the first Gaza war (2008/09) when the missiles from Gaza falling on the kibbutz became routine.

Ronit and her family are survivors of the October 7th massacre of Kibbutz Kfar-Aza where over 60 people were murdered and 19 were taken hostage. 5 hostages from Kfar-Aza remain in captivity.

This screening will help us reflect on the plight of the hostages, and give us another opportunity to see the human element of the crisis facing Israel.
