Lighting the Menorah

Hanukkah is a joyous festival. It is marked by the lighting of candles in the home, beginning with one candle on the first night, and add one on each following night of the holiday.

One candle acts as the **Shammash** - which means 'one who serves'. Since we are forbidden to make use of the Hanukkah lights, the light from the Shammash provides the legal fiction whereby we may read, etc. in the proximity of the Hanukkah lamp.

So that everyone knows Hanukkah is here, we place the candles near a window facing the street. The lighting ceremony is accompanied by blessings and followed by Psalm 30.

On Friday night, the lighting of the menorah precedes the lighting of the Shabbat candles.

On Saturday night, the menorah is lit <u>after</u> Havdalah is recited.

Before kindling the lights, say these blessings

(1) "Blessed are You, O L-rd our G-d, King of the universe, Who has sanctified us by Your commandments, and commanded us to kindle the light of Hanukkah."

(2) Blessed are You, O L-rd our G-d, King of the universe, who wrought miracles for our fathers in days of old, at this season.

<u>*When kindling the Hanukkah lights on the First night recite:</u> Blessed art Thou, L-rd our G-d, Ruler of the universe, that Thou hast given us life and sustenance and brought us to this happy season.

Ba-rukh A-tah Ado-nai E-lo-he-nu Me-lekh Ha-olam she-hehe-ya-nu ve-ki-yi-ma-nu ve-higi-a-nu liz-man ha-zeh.

<u>After the candles are lit, recite the 'Ha-nerot Hallalu'</u> (provided here in English) followed by Psalm 30 (p. 22 in the DeSola Pool Siddur):

During all the eight days of Hanukkah, these lights are sacred and it is not permitted to make any profane use of them, but we are only to look at them, in order that we may give thanks unto His name for His miracles, His deliverance and His wonder.


Light candles after sunset (except before/after Sabbath - see below)

1st Candle	Wednesday Eve December 25 (after 4:35 pm)	
2nd Candle	Thursday Eve	December 26 (after 4:35 pm)
3rd Candle	Friday Eve December 27 Light BEFORE Sundown, <u>before</u> lighting Sabbath Candles (in Cedarhurst = 4:17 pm)	
4th Candle	Saturday Eve December 28 <i>Light <u>after</u> Havdalah</i> (Havdalah in Cedarhurst = 5:10 pm)	
5th Candle	Sunday Eve	December 29 (after 4:37 pm)
6th Candle	Monday Eve	December 30 (after 4:38 pm)
7th Candle	Tuesday Eve	December 31 (after 4:39 pm)
8th Candle	Wednesday Eve January 1 (after 4:40 pm)


SHAMMASH -
